

The St. Stephens Advisory Board is currently accepting letters of intent for immediate membership.

The Advisory Board functions as part of the Parish and has a **consultative** responsibility. The consultative responsibilities include "long-range planning, school policy, developing and monitoring the annual budget including tuition and fees, repair and maintenance policies and recommendations concerning buildings, grounds and equipment, Board evaluation and evaluation of the Principal in accordance with Diocesan guidelines."

The Board meets monthly from September through June, typically on the third Thursday of the month at 5 PM at St. Stephen School. Each Board member is required to additionally serve on or Chair one of the operating committees of the Board that meet separately.

Eligibility for membership states that individuals must be 18 years age or older, registered members or St. Stephen Parish or school alumni.
