The St. Thomas More Guild announces its 17th annual scholarship for students attending Catholic elementary and high schools during the 2023-24 school year.

One \$1,000.00 scholarship will be awarded to a student attending a Catholic elementary school, and one \$1,500.00 scholarship will be awarded to a student attending a Catholic high school. The scholarship contest rules, and application are attached. We encourage all eligible students to apply.

Thomas More was born in London, England on February 7, 1478, the son of Sir John More, a prominent judge. Thomas More has been described as "a man for all seasons". He was a literary scholar, eminent lawyer, gentleman, father of four children and chancellor of England. He was a deeply spiritual man, so he would not acknowledge King Henry VIII as supreme head of the Church in England. King Henry VIII had broken ties with Rome and refused to acknowledge the Pope as head of the Church because the Pope refused to grant his divorce from his wife, Catherine of Aragon. Thomas More would not compromise his own moral values to please the King. King Henry VIII tried desperately to win his chancellor to his side because he knew that More was a man "whose approval counted, a man whose personal integrity no one questioned".

Although Thomas More was committed to the Tower of London to await trial for treason, he remained true to his moral values and his Christian faith, refusing to betray his conscience even at the cost of his own life. His story is an example of great courage. In 1935 Thomas More was canonized a saint and is the patron saint of lawyers.

SCHOLARSHIP CONTEST RULES

- 1. The contest is open to all students currently in grades 6-11 who will attend in the 2023-24 academic year a Catholic school located in the Diocese of Buffalo.
- 2. All scholarship applicants must submit an essay on the following topic:

St. Thomas More gave up his life rather than abandon his Catholic faith. He was a lawyer, an important government official, a loving husband and father, a brilliant scholar and writer. When the king ordered him to do something that he knew was wrong, he refused and was put to death,

Identify someone that you consider to be a modern St. Thomas More who has made a sacrifice to follow his or her faith. Explain why you chose that person and what specifically makes that person a modern-day St. Thomas More.

- 3. The essay must be typed. The maximum length of the essay is 500 words.
- 4. The application must accompany the essay. The current grade of the student should be placed in the upper right-hand corner of the first page of the essay. The essay must not contain the writer's name or school.
- 5. The Scholarship Application and essay must be mailed to:

- 6. The application and essay must be postmarked on or before March 31, 2023.
- 7. Winners will be contacted after April 30, 2023.
- 8. The essay will be judged according to the grade level of the student and the judges will not know the identity of the applicant during the judging process.
- 9. Scholarship awards are paid jointly to the winner and school.
- 10. The awards will be presented at the annual luncheon which will be held at the Buffalo Convention Center Spring, 2023.
