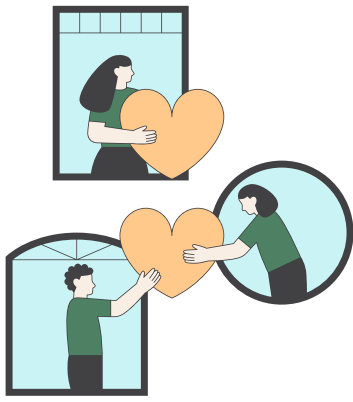

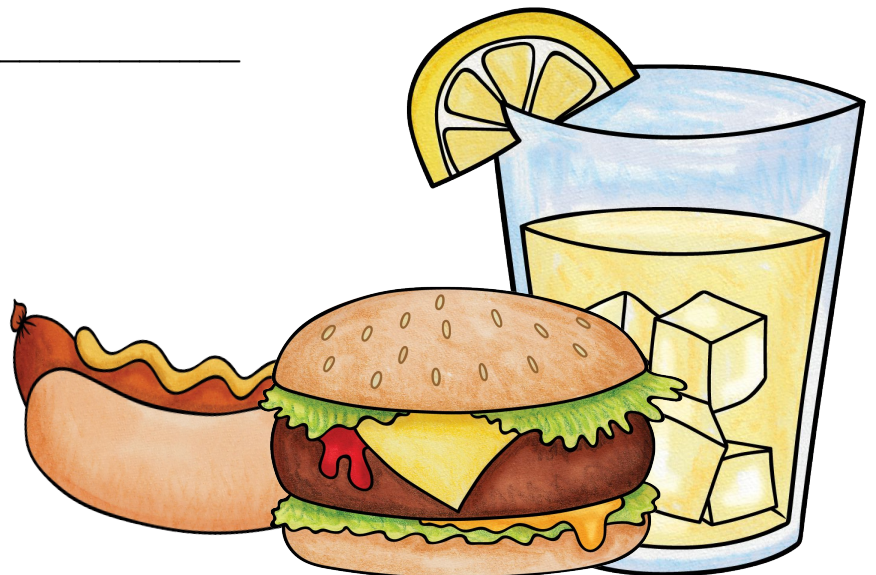

Again, St. Stephens is offering Summer Extended Learning Sessions. These are 3 hour long sessions that last over the course of one week. Each day there will be separate AM and PM sessions. PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS:

1. UNDER THE SEA

Teacher: Miss Mermigas

This week will be filled with sea life stories and exploration! From mermaids to jellyfish, we will explore all different kinds of sea creatures, fiction and nonfiction! Tips for a Successful Fundraiser

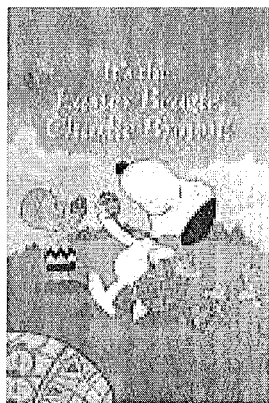
Use the following steps as a template for success. Successful fundraisers have these same principles in common.

3. People who like the product or event you're selling Reach out to anyone you can think of that falls under these categories. They'll be happy to help!
4. Know That People Buy from People, Not Link

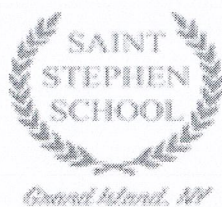
